

Welcome from Revd Mike Taylor

Dear friends,

THANK YOU!

As I start to write this I want to say a huge thank you to Ghika and Rhiannon who have been putting our magazine together now for a while, especially Ghika who has done such an amazing job. Also to Mark for his vision and drive that bought about the change in format and the next change to appearance and who continues to work on the magazine, its contents, direction, present and future. Things get done when people work together and I just wanted to acknowledge that as I begin my thoughts – or ramblings!

REFLECTION

I am very fortunate that as part of my full-time work I am encouraged to continually learn and study. I have chosen to take the opportunity of studying a subject that is close to my heart and at a higher level. This means three residential study periods a year and I have recently returned from the last one. In this one we looked at the whole area of reflection and how working together on a common project can produce some amazing results. How groups like this are formed and how what they discover might grow and improve over time with reflection! I have to say I do not consider myself a very reflective sort of person. I tend to think as I do, at least I now know that is a legitimate form of reflective practice, but maybe not good alone! I guess after more than 27 years in parish ministry I am used to reflecting

as things happen and never, until now, thought about reflecting on an event after it happened! I will endeavour to be more reflective going forward. When I went to this period of study I had little understanding of the subject. I reflect on the scriptures I use in my preaching, I prepare any teaching I do and I have been through so demanding and mundane experiences that have needed careful handling and negotiations. To be faced with a whole module on this was daunting and even worse to have to write 4,500 words on the subject! If nothing else it has caused me to stop and reflect! So it has worked to a certain extent but can I write a convincing essay on it?

SHARING WITH FRIENDS

What was once normal, in that people talked everything over with others in the community, is not so normal now. It used to be that if something happened you would chat with neighbours, friends, relatives or church members you trusted! Neighbourhoods have

been devalued as so much today is about 'my space' and 'my decision' and 'my direction' to ask for advice from others is to expose a 'weakness' and we want to be seen as being in control! We are a funny race because we are reticent in sharing things with traditional confidants and yet willing to post on social media what we did last night, what we think about politics and even how glorious the meal looked that we ate. Social Media has presented us with New Communities - sometimes made up of people we don't really know and who remain anonymous we don't chat face to face, we post and see what response we get.

Maybe as a society we would be naturally more reflective if we went back to chatting things over with those we trust. Maybe that is a reflection on the sort of ministry I do, as part of the church, in that we are more often than not left to fend for ourselves than given obvious support!

I must learn to reflect more before I do something, as I do something and indeed after I do something! This will be good for me!



Forty Years Ago this Month - March 1979

LEN LAMBERT

Len Lambert recalls the events he recorded in his diary for this month:

- The Cardiff to Newcastle Express hit a Lorry on a level crossing at Lydney in Gloucester on the 1st resulting in three deaths including both drivers
- The 10th anniversary of Concord's first flight came on the 2nd
- On the same day Scotland and Wales both voted for Devolution
- The Voyager Space probe passed close to Jupiter sending back first class pictures on the 5th
- March may have come in like a lamb, but severe gales and more snow flurries were the order of the day on the 9th
- The Space Shuttle's slow journey to the launch pad from the factory was delayed when bits began to fall off on the 11th
- Britain was hit by heavy snow on the 17th, four inches falling in our area. The next day British summertime came into force
- Farmers were a month behind in Spring drilling and getting worried on the 27th
- Only seven horses finished the Grand National on the 31st: Rubstick winning.
 The favourite Alverston being destroyed after a fall
- Snow fell on ten days, strong to gale force winds for eight days and frost lay on the ground for four days.

Tom Boden is General Manager of the National Trust responsible for managing the National Trust properties in Bath which include the Bath Skyline, Prior Park Landscape Garden and the Bath Assembly Rooms (currently leased to Bath and North East Somerset Council). tastes to be explored and explained, developing questioning and reasoning skills in a natural, fun way.

Recipes of the month

The days are getting longer, lambs are in the fields, spring flowers are everywhere, and the clocks are going forward! Celebrate the coming of spring with this vegetarian supper: a lovely brie and walnut tart followed by a naughty pudding!

BRIE AND WALNUT TART

Ingredients

- 1 pack shortcrust pastry
- 1 large leek, trimmed and finely sliced
- 1 oz/25g butter
- Large pack fresh spinach
- Salt, ground pepper and grated nutmeg
- 8 oz/225g Brie, ripe but still firm
- 6 oz/175g walnut halves
- 3 large eggs
- 3 fl oz/75 ml crème fraiche
- 3 fl oz/75 ml milk

Method

- Roll out the pastry and use to line a 9"/23 cm flan tin. Chill while you prepare the rest of the ingredients.
- Sauté the leeks gently in the butter until becoming soft, then add the spinach and stir until wilted.
- 3. Season with salt, pepper and nutmeg.
- Raise the heat to drive off most of the moisture and arrange in the pastry case.
- Sprinkle with half the walnuts, roughly chopped.



- 6. Slice the brie and arrange on top, filling in the gaps with the remaining walnut halves.
- 7. Whisk the eggs, crème fraiche and milk, seasoning with salt and pepper. Pour into the flan and bake at 400°F/200°C/Gas 6 for about 30 minutes until risen and golden.
- 8. Serve with small new potatoes and a colourful mixed salad.

TIRAMISU

Ingredients

- 3 large eggs, separated
- 2 oz /50g caster sugar
- 250 gm tub Mascarpone
- 5 fl oz/150 ml very strong black coffee
- 3 tablespoons Amaretto liqueur or dark rum
- 200g pack Boudoir biscuits
- 4 oz dark chocolate, roughly grated

Method

- In a clean bowl, and with clean beaters, whisk the egg whites to the soft peak stage.
- 2. In another bowl, beat the egg yolks with the sugar until very pale.
- Then, on slow speed, beat in the mascarpone until well combined.
- 4. Lightly fold the egg whites into the mascarpone mixture and set aside.
- Mix the coffee and liqueur in a shallow bowl.
- Dip both sides of a boudoir biscuit very briefly into the liquid (they soak it up very rapidly!)
- Make a layer of these dipped biscuits in your serving dish (a square or oblong one would be easiest!).

- 8. Spread with a layer of the mascarpone mix and a sprinkling of chocolate.
- 9. Carry on with the layers, finishing with a mascarpone layer.
- Sprinkle on the remaining chocolate, and if there isn't enough left, cocoa powder is a good substitute.
- 11. Refrigerate for several hours, or overnight is fine.
- 12. You could also make six individual portions in pretty glasses.
- 13. You almost certainly won't want any more cream to serve with this very rich pudding!
- 14. To make the pudding even more special, serve with a few fresh raspberries on each portion.

A Message from the Right Reverend Ruth Worsley, Bishop of Taunton

LET HIM LOOK AT YOU

The other day, someone was speaking about visiting with her elderly mum. She was telling us that whenever she visited she would offer to do any jobs that might be needed and beyond her mum's reach. Her mum's response was to say: "Just sit down and let me look at you." I've been thinking about that conversation ever since.

What a wonderful thing to say to your child: "Just sit down and let me look at you."

She was sharing this vignette, a year after her mum's death. There are no more opportunities for her mum to 'sit and look at her'. How glad she is that she took the time whilst her mum was alive.

I wonder if I can say the same. Have I made time for the things that really matter or am I so focused on the tasks at hand that I forget the need for space to develop relationships? I have a sense that this isn't just about the people who matter to me, but also that it may be Jesus speaking to me as well. "Just sit down and let me look at you."

The story of Mary and Martha opening up their home to Jesus in hospitality perhaps reminds us most of the priority of spending time in the presence of Jesus. Martha complains at Mary's lack of support in helping with the household jobs. Jesus' response is to suggest that Martha has become so distracted with the 'tasks' of hospitality that she has missed the point of what welcome and relationship is.

We often think of this story as being about Mary and Martha's priorities. Which is of greater significance? Our attitude of service or that of spiritual exploration? However I'm wondering if Jesus was saying something more. "Just sit down and let me look at you." What would Jesus see if He looked at you? How does He look at you?

March 8th is international women's day, often an opportunity to remind us that society's way of looking at women has changed over the years. The 'Me Too' movement has revealed some of the ways in which women have been objectified resulting in forms of abuse. Alongside that growing realisation we are increasingly aware that many women and men feel a sense of dissatisfaction with how they look and can find their mental health affected as a result. Many of us find another person looking at us, uncomfortable.

I'd like to suggest that we might hear these words, "Just sit down and let me look at you." as an invitation from Jesus to spend time under his gaze this week. Not as a means of incurring shame but rather to receive the look of love that he so wants us to see.

Wildlife Diary


WALLS, BANKS AND WILDLIFE

We all walk, run, cycle or drive past the drystone walls and various banks in our villages every day and do not necessarily consider them as vital habitats for insects, amphibians, and some of the smaller mammals such as mice, shrews etc, and of course many species of flora.

Our wonderful primary school at Freshford is taking up the cause of promoting the needs and concerns of these ecosystems. There may well be BANK..SY style artwork emitting from their Science Week held last month. You can see the end results on the school website

www.freshfordschool.org.uk.

South facing walls and banks are particularly useful to reptiles that need to bask or otherwise warm up using the sun's energy. There is a wonderful leaflet as a download from the Amphibian and Reptile Conservation



Trust website. Simply web search 'Dragons in your Gardens'. There you will find great information and ideas for making our gardens more inviting for frogs, toads, newts, snakes and lizards.

Interestingly we have reports of Common Lizards in rockeries and walls in Limpley Stoke. These rare creatures like well drained habitats including rockeries. Let's look out for them this summer.

The very helpful Drystone Walling Association website dswa.org.uk gives useful insights into the wall dwelling Flora and Fauna found in this type of

> habitat. "Dry stone walls are in effect, one huge linear nature reserve and they merit preservation."

This same website also provides excellent guides to build or repair drystone walls. A simple low three foot high step in garden levels is very easy to construct using their retaining wall method and becomes a wildlife superhighway!

Wall design leaflets are a free download from the 'shop' page of their website. See also their reasonably priced construction and wildlife handbooks. Drystone walling courses are regularly available in our area.

Book review: Educated

BY TARA WESTOVER

This memoir was recommended to our book group by another group in the Parish as having received very positive feedback. We certainly experienced the same positivity: it is one of the best discussed books we have read.

This Tara Westover's memoir covers her life since a small child, brought up within a strict Mormon family in Idaho. Her parents have rejected many aspects of modern western society such as hospital births, conventional medicine, state education and other elements perceived as interfering state controls. In the background, the father is an ever-growing extremist, a

'survivalist,' who believes in the second coming/ end of civilised society-style apocalypse and so stockpiles weapons, fuel, produce and other goods. Her mother is an unofficial midwife and herbalist who sometimes aids Tara, but for the most part is beholden to the will of her husband. Meanwhile there is a

brutal, aggressive older brother who physically attacks Tara and brings fear to her very core.

Tara's father does not let her attend school, and instead has her working in horrific and dangerous conditions in his scrap-yard based within the grounds of the ramshackle house in the foot of the Idaho Mountains. There are powerful descriptions of the physicality of the work and the injuries she and other

siblings experience on the site - injuries and subsequent miraculous survivals which are deemed by her Father to be God's Will.

But with another brother's help who has himself escaped to College, Tara manages to educate herself for the required tests and wins a place at College. Her description of battling her way through schooling tasks which other students find so straight forward such as lectures, essay writing and revision are both painful and heart-warming as she exceeds

all expectations. She goes on to win a specialist year studying in Cambridge followed by a PhD.

When she returns home the violence of her other brother Shawn increases, and somehow, she finds the strength to challenge and expose him.

Some stories and incidents in Tara's life are shocking and terrifying, but the most eye-opening aspect of this book is how recent the events are, Tara is now in her mid-30s, to think that this family exists in 21st Century America! I think about her family still in Idaho – those she has exposed and those who let her down when she was finally able to challenge the violence of her brother.


